The exhibition will be touring the country after its premier in Liverpool. It is the largest textile project by a single artist, Jacqui Parkinson.

The ladies were in awe; the silk panels looked amazing against the backdrop of the Cathedrals splendour. The artist had spent 10 years completing the 44 panels, which incorporated 25 million stitches - wow! If the panels were to be put side by side they would stretch more that 80 metres. Quite incredible!



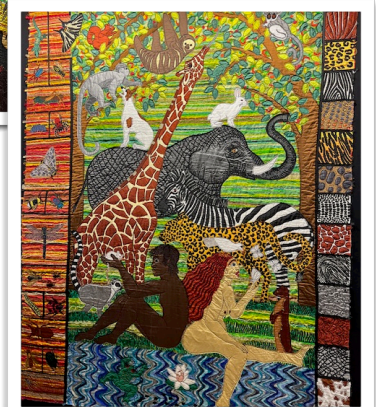
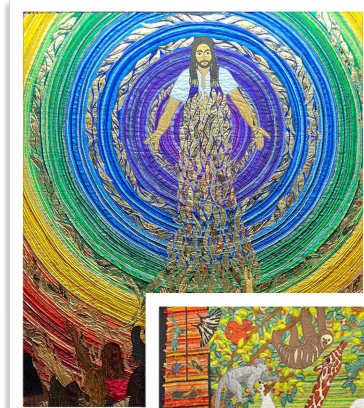
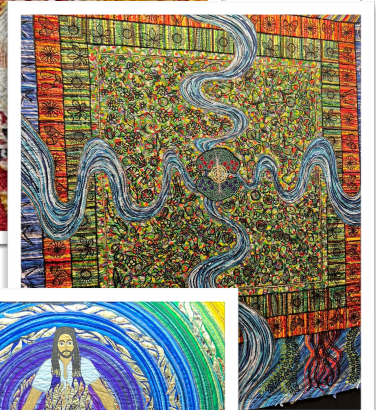
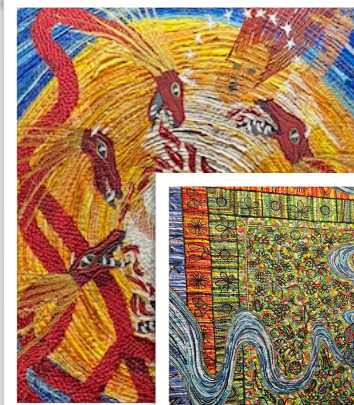
Having enjoyed the displays, the ladies left for lunch (it had been an early start!).
